Spotlight Speaker: Denise Parker, Creighton Financial Hope Collaborative

Denise spoke about the Financial Success Program, a comprehensive financial education program that focuses on single mothers. The curriculum helps in tracking expenses, saving for emergencies, taxes, insurance, legal issues, psychology of money, and repairing credit reports. Dinner and child care are available during sessions. After 8 week of classes, coaches are assigned to the students to help them implement their plan.
